



Regulation

CLC Healthcare Regulation operates based on common law, natural law, universal law, the creator's law, or God's law, with the aim of safeguarding individuals and ensuring that all healthcare professionals adhere to ethical and lawful practices.

Only those with a valid certificate issued by CLC Healthcare Regulation may operate under this system and must comply with the following.

- a) All professionals must complete a declaration of birth on the Common Law Court website, this is to confirm that they are living, not a corporation and that they operate under the authority, jurisdiction and protection of the Common Law Court.
- b) All professionals are required to provide a copy of their original qualifications which must be lodged with CLC Healthcare Regulation.
- c) All professionals are required to provide copies of all additional qualifications that they have obtained throughout their career, these must also be lodged with CLC Healthcare Regulation.
- d) All practitioners are required to provide a professional statement containing details of their relevant experience within the healthcare sector.

CLC Healthcare Regulation is responsible for monitoring the world healthcare system and will investigate when its standards and care have not been met. These investigations may also take into consideration the health professionals' fitness to retain their existing position and if necessary, may lead to disciplinary and/or enforcement action to protect the people.

To ensure the required standards of care and ethics are met, CLC Healthcare Regulation refers to our founding principles of:

CLC Healthcare Regulation is managed by a team of suitably qualified men and women from within the industry. Each having the relevant experience within their own field, to hold their position. While CLC Healthcare Regulation exists to protect client safety and wellbeing, they may also take relevant steps to ensure that all ethical standards are maintained.

This regulatory body will also be responsible for maintaining an up-to-date list of declarations for all professionals working under its care.
